It was a very interesting evening last Thursday night, with a visit from our Rural Medical Students. The students visiting were Shevaun Ely, Hannah Wood, Jessica Weber and Megan Deakin. They were joined by Prof Malcolm Moore, Organisational Unit Member for the Rural Clinical School and Nadine Masters, Administrator for the ANU Rural Clinical School at Batemans Bay. Prof. Moore

commenced with the ANU Medical School in 2015 as an Associate Professor Rural Health. He also taught at Broken Hill University in a joint position with the Royal Flying Doctors Service. The Rural Doctor program has approx. 26 students from the ANU in the program. The students, who have an interest in rural medicine, apply for the limited placements. We had a great presentation from Shevaun Ely who had recently done a placement at Tennant Creek NT. She gave a great insight into the medical situation in that region. The hospital is only a 20 bed hospital and the only hospital for 500km. They have no CT or MRI and only six bags of blood kept on site and the nearest referral centre is Alice Springs. Some very sad facts, the region has the highest rate of kidney disease anywhere in the world, 1 in 4 of the Indigenous population has chronic kidney disease and the youngest person in the region on dialysis is only 30 years of age.
