Thought I would give you and your club an update on Asha's education village north of Kathmandu. Due to the monsoon no construction work for the new school has begun and there have been many landslides preventing travel to the village. Hopefully the monsoon will end within the next few weeks and the roads can be cleared. Your club's donation will be going towards the rebuild of the school. At present the students are having their lessons in make shift classrooms made from bamboo and sheets of tin. I have attached some photos to give a clear picture of the situation.

It was hoped that Rohan and I would be going to Nepal in November, but given the delay in construction, access to the village we may not be going until early next year now, I will keep you posted on developments.
