Michael Matuschka is the head teacher of Human Society and its Environment at BBHS. Accompanying him on Thursday evening was Sam Hanlon, President of BB Interact Club and Joshua Paranthoiene, who is a member of the Student Environmental Council. The S.E.C has at about 20 members and runs from Year 8 to Year 12. The younger generation are fully aware of the problems facing us globally and locally and want to do something about it. With grants from the NSW Government and the Teachers Federation, the SEC has planted indigenous vegetation, mainly small shrubs to bring back birds and insects. They have taken part in Leadership Camps and learned about permaculture and food growing. This was sponsored by the Eurobodalla Council. The students lobbied for increased solar power at the school and the school is being linked up to a 100KW system costing \$50,000 of which half will met by the Dept. of Education. This will offset 40% of power used. The "Return and Earn" container recycling program may generate income of \$2000 per year. Josh was convinced that students following will continue to contribute and maybe influence other schools. The BBHS will be entering a debating team at MUNA again this year and their country will be Iran. Michael thanked Rotary for the opportunity to take a team to Canberra and give this experience to the students. Model United Nations Assembly runs over the weekend of the 18th & 19th August at Old Parliament House.
