#### **END POLIO UPDATE -**

Pakistan and Afghanistan, the two remaining countries where polio is endemic have joined forces to eradicate polio by vaccinating their children in synchronised campaigns on both sides of the border. These countries, which share a 2,400km porous border, have been bracketed as the major stumbling block in the drive for global eradication of polio. The government has enlisted the support of Islamic scholars to combat parental refusals to the Taliban's anti-vaccine campaign. They are accompanying health workers to urge parents to inoculate their children.
