

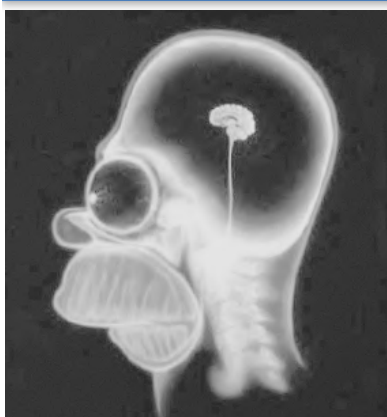

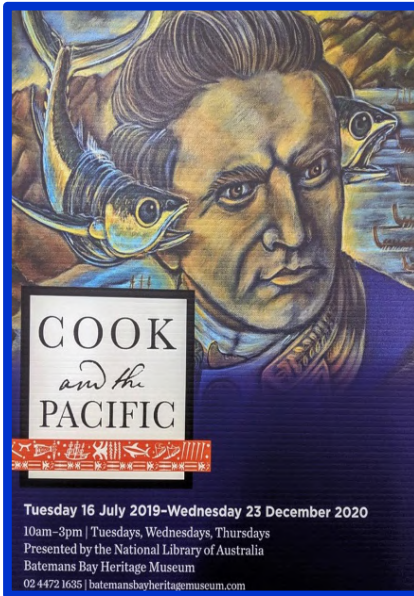

Below email received from our Exchange Student, Matilda, in Austria

I'm halfway through my exchange year now! It's been a crazy 6 months, but I feel like I've finally figured it all out; what it means to be an exchange student, how to deal with tough situations, etc.

At the start of July, I went to Prague with my class for three days. It was so amazing! I think Prague is my new favourite European city. We went on a few tours of the city and learnt so much about the history (most of which I've forgotten). It was also the last time I would be hanging out with the other exchange student in Graz, from Canada. So we had lots of fun together.

Last Monday, I moved to a new lovely host family. Their daughter, Johanna, came back from being on exchange in Australia, two days after I moved. She is so so fun and energetic, and we talk lots about Australia and exchange. I've gotten to meet a few of her friends so far and I hope to become good friends with them. We also went to an ABBA costume party, and I met more family members and close family friends. The rest of the family is super nice too. The sister-in-law from my host mum said to me (as she was trying to convince me to sing karaoke) that I don't need to worry about anything because they are my new family now. That was so indescribably lovely.

My new family lives on the top floor in an apartment building that overlooks the city. There is a lovely graveyard (Friedhof, in German) right across from the apartment.

My language skills are improving constantly. Every day I learn something new. People are also saying that my German is very good for only 6 months of being here, and that I have almost no Australia accent. That is really awesome to hear.

Hope all is well in Australia, and not too cold for you all!
