Mayor Lindsay Brown spoke firstly of his journey from diagnosis to healing with prostate cancer. He has been using his profile as Mayor to help lift awareness and is again holding a dinner at the Soldiers Club in August to raise funds. In regard to Council matters he spoke of three things. Firstly council is seeking input to projects the community needs. Suggestions can be logged on the Council website and they will be included in the forward estimates.

Following purchase of the former Bowling Club site, Council is seeking ideas for its use and suggestions can again be logged on the Council website. Also looking for public private partnerships or joint ventures. The next Council will make the final decision about its use.

In relation to the Flying Fox issue, Council has developed a dispersal plan which is out for comment. He explained the constraints the Council has in dealing with the issue, the cost (\$6.2m), community issues and the likelihood that dispersal may not work.

Captain Ross Holland from the Salvation Army

Disbursements from the Budget – not yet paid

- Snowy Hydro Southcare helicopter - \$2000
- Australian Rotary Health – \$300 (to make up to \$1000)
- Can Assist Batemans Bay - \$1000
- ROMAC (Rotary Overseas Medical Aid for Children) - \$1000
- St Cecilia Music Scholarship - \$1000

Also resolved

- In principle support to purchase a motor for the new surf club boat when purchased.
- Provide Batemans Bay Football Club with jerseys for U12 team - \$560 and perpetual shield for “Junior Club Person of the Year” and \$50 prize
- In principal commit \$1500 per annum over three years for an Australian Rotary Health Indigenous Scholarship;
- Further contribution of \$350 (total \$850) towards shared cost with Moruya and Narooma of facility upgrade at Riding for the Disabled;
