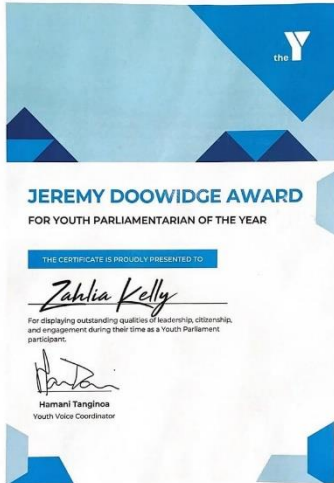

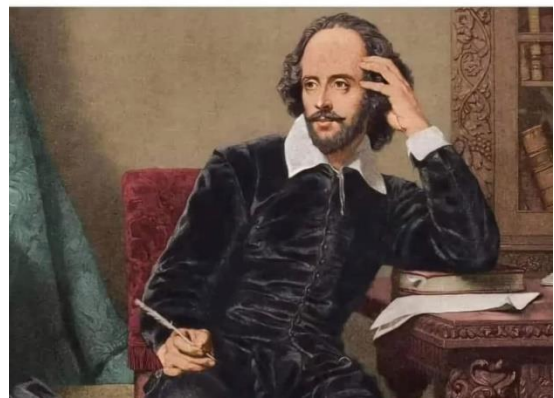

**Gaza (occupied Palestinian territory)** - Earlier this month, a 10-month-old unvaccinated child in Gaza contracted Polio and became paralyzed in one leg. The spread of polio, a highly infectious disease, poses life-threatening risks for children – especially as the majority of Gaza's hospitals and health clinics have been destroyed or are only partially functioning.

**Today** - The Israeli military and Palestinian militant group Hamas have agreed to three separate, zoned three-day pauses in **fighting** in the Gaza Strip to allow for the vaccination of some 640,000 children against polio, a senior WHO official said on Thursday.
